PART 2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

To be read in conjunction to the Part 1 Sailing Instructions. Part 2 SI may amend or be in addition to Part 1 SI and NOR. In case of conflict, Part 2 SI shall prevail.

Race Management Group: Roger Wilson, Jenny Wilson

1. RULES - See Part 1 Sailing Instructions Section 1, amended by:

- 1.1 RRS 35 is amended; see Part 2 Sailing Instructions 10.1 below.
- 1.2 Alterations to Rules:
- 1.3 IRC rule 27 is altered to permit boats to race without "mattresses and cushion backs" on board and without change to their TCC.

2. CLASSES TO BE RACED

2.1 The Classes to race will be as follows:

- 1 IRC boats of 1.000 and above
- 2 IRC boats of 0.940 to 0.999
- 3 IRC boats of 0.939 and below
- 4 Sportsboats as designated by the Race Committee
- 5 Folkboats
- 6 Lympington Handicap boats with an upper limit of 1.070

- 2.2 Should there be 6 or more entries for a particular type of boat within one of the above Classes, then a separate Class for that type may be included.
- 2.3 Should there be fewer than 6 entries for a Class, that Class may be excluded.
- 2.4 The Race Committee may adjust the definition, the numbers, and/or the handicap limits of the various Classes as appropriate to ensure good racing.
- 2.5 Lympington Handicap 2008 Issue shall apply. See note 2 under additional information.

3. SAFETY - See NOR Section 3, amended by:

- 3.1 All boats shall carry functional VHF radio at least with channels 16, 72, 77, M1 (37). This changes Part 1 SI 3.10.

4. SCHEDULE OF RACES AND FLAGS

- 4.1 The 2008 Henri Lloyd - Royal Lympington Yacht Club Spring Series will consist of a ten race series with up to two races a day depending on the and the conditions. The aim will be to finish racing by 1330.
- 4.2 The time of the first warning signal for the first race of each day will be 09.25hrs BST.
- 4.3 The Class warning flags, and the intended warning times for the first race will be as follows:

Class	Flag	Warning Time
1 IRC	N PENNANT 1	09.25hrs
2 IRC	N PENNANT 2	09.30hrs
3 IRC	N PENNANT 3	09.35hrs
4 Sportsboats	N PENNANT 4	09.40hrs
5 Folkboats	FLAG F	09.45hrs
6 Club Handicap	N PENNANT 6	09.50hrs

- 4.4 The intended Order of Starts shall be as follows: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6.
- 4.5 The Race Committee may amend the intended order of starting without notice. However it will endeavour to communicate such changes via VHF in good time for the race.
- 5. COMMUNICATION WITH COMPETITORS - See Part 1 SI Section 5, amended by:**
- 5.1 A time check will be broadcast at 0900 On VHF channel 72, (or channel 77 if 72 is inoperable, see Part 1 SI) followed by a race status announcement.
- 5.2 The courses for Classes 1, 2, 3 and 6 will be broadcast immediately after the attention signal, and each class's course will be repeated immediately after their Warning Signal.
- 6. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE - See Part 1 Sailing Instructions Section 6, amended by:**
- 6.1 All signals made ashore will be displayed above flag Naval Numeral 0 from the RLymYC flagstaff.
- 7. THE START - See Part 1 Sailing Instructions Section 7, amended by:**
- 7.1 The area of the starting line will be announced after the time check at 0900. Usually this will be to the east of the RLymYC Platform.
- 8. THE FINISH - See Part 1 Sailing Instructions Section 8.**
- 9. COURSES - See Part 1 Sailing Instructions Section 9, amended by:**
- 9.1 Each mark (navigation buoy or special racing mark) has been allocated a symbol (letter or number) as shown in Appendix 1 Part 1 SI. In addition, the following moveable marks may be used:

M	MOVABLE MARK No 1	6' Orange inflatable buoy
N	MOVABLE MARK No 2	6' Black inflatable buoy
P	MOVABLE MARK No 3	6' Blue inflatable buoy
Q	MOVABLE MARK No 4	6' Yellow inflatable buoy

- 9.2 When displayed, the course to be sailed will be indicated by the symbols displayed on boards on one side of the Committee Boat. The first board (black on white) will indicate the Class to which that course applies.
- 9.3 The Courses for Classes 1, 2, 3 and 6 will be broadcast on VHF immediately after the Attention Signal (orange flag) is displayed by the Committee Boat. Each Class' course will be repeated immediately after their Warning Signal.
- 9.4 The course to be sailed by Class 4 and the Folkboats will be displayed on the Committee Boat before their warning signal. This changes Part 1 SI 9.1.
- 9.5 When the course to be sailed is announced on VHF, the list of marks in the order in which they are to be rounded or passed, the side it is required that they are rounded, or passed, and the number of laps, if more than one, will be announced immediately after the Attention Signal and repeated after each Class's Warning Signal.
- 9.6 **At the end of each round, boats shall pass through the finishing line from the direction of the previous mark.**
- 10. TIME LIMIT**
- 10.1 The time limit for the first finisher of each for the first race of the day will be 3 hours. The time limit for the first finisher of each Class for the second race on that day will be 2 hours. Boats that finish within 30 minutes of the first boat in their Class will be scored according to their corrected finishing place. Other boats will be scored DNF. The Race Committee may broadcast information regarding time limits on VHF. This amends RRS 35.

11. SCORING - See Part 1 Sailing Instructions Section 11, amended by:

- 11.1 The Low Points Scoring System of RRS Appendix A will apply including A9.
- 11.2 Three races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 11.3 When fewer than four races have been completed, a boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores.
- 11.4 When from four to seven races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 11.5 When eight or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

12. PROTESTS - See Part 1 Sailing Instructions Section 12, amended by:

- 12.1 If the race office is not manned at the time a boat representative wishes to hand in a protest then that the completed protest form should be handed to a member of the race organisation team or to a member of the club bar staff. A protest log book will be available in the race office and the boat representative must complete this log entry fully to record when and where the protest has been lodged.
- 12.2 The organisers will attempt to contact any boat involved in a protest, However it is the responsibility of each entrant to check the notice board to establish if their boat has been involved in a protest, and the process then to be followed
- 12.3 Advisory and Arbitration hearings will, where possible, be heard after the finish of racing on the day the incident took place.
- 12.4 Unless notified otherwise, full protest hearings will be heard from 1500 on the Sunday following the day on which the race concerned took place, except for the last race of the series, when any protests will be heard on the same day.

13. PRIZES

- 13.1 A bottle prize for each winner each week will be presented in the RLymYC Bar if the winner is present.
- 13.2 The Series prize-giving with prizes, including Henri Lloyd sailing gear will be held at the Royal Lyminster Yacht Club as soon as possible after racing on Sunday 27 April.

A full cooked breakfast will be available on race days in the River Room from 07.30.

SI 4.4 (Order of Starts) is amended to read:

- Class 1
- Class 2
- Class 5
- Class 6

The Race Committee may amend the intended order of starting without notice. However it will endeavour to communicate such changes via VHF in good time for the race.
